SUBJECT: Immunizations

According to school health records:

- Your child has no record of immunization on file in school. You must provide the school with the records of your child's immunizations. If your child has not been immunized, you must obtain the necessary immunizations and provide the school with the record.
- Your child's immunization record is incomplete. You must obtain a record of your child having received the following immunizations:
 - DPT - Diphtheria, Pertussis (Whooping Cough), Tetanus

If your child has not received these immunizations or a physical examination, you must obtain them and provide the school with the record.

If your doctor says immunization might be harmful to your child, you must send a written statement, signed by your doctor.

If you object to immunization for good cause, for example religious convictions, you must submit a signed statement. Forms are available from the school clinic.

Ohio Law - Shaded Areas Required for School Entry

DtaP, DPT or DT						5th dose required if 4th dose given before age 4
Tdap/Td						Effective 2010-11 and thereafter, one dose is required prior to entry into seventh (7 th) grade
Polio						Receipt of at least three (3) doses of OPV or IPV individually is required: if all OPV or all IPV are received. 4 th dose required if 3 rd dose given before age 4. If any combination of IPV or OPV were received, four doses of either vaccine are required. Effective 2010-2011 and thereafter, for all students entering K, 4 doses are required, the final dose of polio must have been administered after the fourth birthday, regardless of the number of previous doses.
