

6th Grade Homework Policies

- Homework assignments are posted daily on Ascend.
- Students are responsible for writing assignments in planners as well.
- All homework is due at the beginning of class unless a student was absent.
- Students have a quiet study hall to begin homework Monday- Thursday from 2:40-3:00
- **Students** are responsible for contacting classmates or teachers (when necessary) for homework questions.
- All teachers are available before and after school for questions.
- Absent students are responsible for getting work/making up work that was missed.
- Students are responsible for checking Ascend for late/missing work, and making up work in a timely manner.
- Students are given time in class to begin homework most days.

Religion:

There is typically no Religion homework. Students are expected to study for quizzes/ tests which take place approximately every one to two weeks.

Reading:

Students are required to read for 20 minutes every day outside of school, either from a required reading selection or an independent reading book of their choice. Reading response activities may also be assigned for homework.

Vocabulary:

Students are required to complete 40 active minutes per week on our online vocabulary program Membean. Students will take an online vocabulary test every other week in class.

Math:

We will typically cover one lesson every day. The assignment is a way for the students to “practice” their math---(10-20 problems every night) Homework is always started in class so students have the opportunity to ask questions. They are usually given 5-10 minutes to start. The homework should not take more that 20-30 minutes at home. I am available before and after school to answer questions. I can also be reached by e-mail. cspinner@st-hilary.org for questions in the evening. There will also be two Simple Solutions lessons per week. These are assigned one week in advance. (These should take approximately 15-20 min. each.)

Social Studies:

Students may be required to read/listen to a lesson on their I-pads. There may be some written work done at home, such as review questions. Students will also need to review their notes to prepare for one test and a few quizzes each quarter. Projects will be completed in school during class time.

Foreign language:

Homework varies with each lesson, usually 15 minutes per week.
