Next week, we will begin registering new students and conclude re-registration of current students for the 2019-2020 school year. Registration for new students entering grades K-8 will be held February 4, 5 and 6 from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the school office. The deadline to re-register returning students online is February 8. Instructions for applying to receive tuition assistance were emailed on January 4 and can also be found on the school website. Applications must be submitted online through FACTS by March 1.

Students in grades K-8 completed MAP testing last month, which is the second round of this progress-based testing for the school year. The final MAP testing will take place in April and May. CAT testing for grades 3, 5 and 7 will take place this spring, with dates to be announced shortly. Please be sure your child has a good night's rest each night and a wholesome breakfast each morning during testing. Students will also need to have several sharpened #2 pencils - please ask your child if his or her supplies need to be replenished. Thank you for avoiding scheduling appointments during testing.

The last few weeks have been busy and exciting. Our eighth graders have completed the process of choosing their high schools and will know later this month where they will be headed in the fall. Our school Geography Bee and Spelling Bee in January had us on the edges of our seats! We congratulate eighth grader Christian Parker, winner of our school Geography Bee, and seventh grader Christopher Paterakis who was runner-up in the competition. Christian was also the school champion in 2017. As the winner of the bee, Christian also received a \$500 scholarship in

memory of St. Hilary School graduate Jimmy Lyons, who won the school bee for four consecutive years between 2003 and 2006, was a state bee competitor, and passed away in 2011. Christian will next take a written test in hopes of qualifying to compete in the state Geography Bee this spring.
