We are always looking for new ways to make our school even better, and have some improvements planned for the upcoming year.

We are eager to begin the replacement of our aging SmartBoards with Promethean Boards in our K-5 classrooms!

Thanks to your generosity in raising and approving funds, our SmartBoards in grades K-5 will be replaced with Promethean Boards as the first phase in this large-scale technology upgrade. Usable SmartBoards will be recycled for temporary use in other areas where possible, until Promethean Boards can be purchased for the remainder of the school. In addition to the new Promethean Boards, each classroom receiving a new board will also receive a new laptop for teacher use. Our goal is to synchronize technology across all classrooms so that all classes and teachers are using the same equipment. We are very excited about the opportunities all of this new technology will bring to enhance student learning!

Our career elective classes for grades 7 and 8 are also being revamped a bit. Introduced in the 2017-2018 school year, these classes quickly became favorites among our junior high students. For 2019-2020, elective classes will be offered three days a week, with the remaining two days being study halls.

Classes will include advanced photography, entrepreneurship/finance, fitness and healthy lifestyle, future Catholic teachers, global perspectives, graphic design, health science, home economics, robotics/coding, Saber Stories/video editing, and study hall.

As we transition from one school year to the next, one final very exciting thing we want to share with you is the planned facelift to our school entrance hallway. Many of the finishes in that area are original to the building, and we want to do what we can to brighten the space without extensive renovation. We look forward to adding fresh paint, framed student artwork, a more cohesive area to showcase awards, a video message board, and other amenities to make this area a more welcoming, modernized space.

## 2019 Testing Scores Released

As you know, all students in grades K-8 have taken the MAP test three times this year, and individual score reports will be sent home with final report cards. The MAP test is the most widely used standardized test worldwide. The percentile rankings below show the degree to which our school scored in comparison to others across the nation who took the test. All students, regardless of ability or need, took the MAP test.
