As many of you know, over the summer we made some significant upgrades to our school technology in the way of new Promethean Boards and new teacher laptops in all of our K-5 classrooms. Most noticeably, though, as you enter the school, will be the fresh look our school entrance has! We now have a more welcoming, modern entrance that not only ties in with our recent Multi-Purpose Room facelift, but also shares key attributes of our school at a glance. All of these upgrades would not have been possible without the support and funding of our Parents' Association through your generosity. The addition of important enhancements such as these underscore our commitment to provide a well-maintained facility and a top-notch environment in which your children can learn and grow each day. As a reminder, the school dress code was emailed to returning families last spring and was provided to new families with their acceptance materials. This code, contained in our school handbook, will be enforced during the school year, so please be sure you are familiar with clothing, shoes and accessories that are permitted and not permitted. Students will be issued a minor infraction notification if they are not in proper school dress code. We will be permitting the "Sunshine" plaid skirts, skorts and jumpers to be worn until the end of the 2019-2020 school year. Please plan ahead as this plaid will be phased out at the end of the current school year. All plaid items must be of the appropriate length - not to exceed 4" above the knee when measured from a kneeling position. Please pay particular attention to *shoes*, which must be leather, low cut, brown/tan, black, navy, grey, (or red - girls). Cloth, plastic, and canvas shoes are not permitted. Vans are not permitted unless they are all black leather with a black sole.

No metallic finishes or sparkles are permitted on shoes. If boys choose to wear athletic shoes, they must be low cut with no contrasting logos, labels or stitching. Sperry style shoes are the only shoes permitted to have a contrasting/white sole; however, the sole must be the traditional thin "boat shoe" style sole, not a thick white sole resembling Vans. **Socks** must be black, white or navy, solid in color, crew or low cut (or knee socks - girls). As for **hair**, St. Hilary School does not permit haircuts that are fad or trend in nature. No shaved lines, tails or bi-level cuts are permitted. Students' hair must remain natural in color. Boys' hair may not cover more than half the ear and must be and off the collar. Hair must not obstruct vision. No facial hair is permitted. Please note several important dates during the next few weeks. School pictures will be taken on September 4, and students should dress up. Please remember that on dress-up days, jeans, T-shirts, crop/tank tops,



sandals, clogs, and tennis shoes (except kindergarteners) are not permitted. Please review the out-of-uniform standards in the school handbook regarding dress-up days. Our first round of MAP testing for students in grades K-8 will take place September 9-27. Our fifth graders will participate in the Cuyahoga Valley Environmental Education Center's outdoor education program September 18-20. Our Parents' Association will hold its first general meeting on October 4 at 8:45 a.m. in the Spiritual Center. All parents are invited to attend and learn more about our Parents' Association and the events planned for this school year.
