DATE & SUBJECT

June 18, 2017 — The Most Holy Body And Blood of Christ



“My flesh is real food and my blood real drink.” (John 6:51-58)

Chapter 6 is known as the crisis in John’s Gospel. Many of those who have followed Jesus up to now desert him after this teaching. It is at this time too that the decision is made to seek an opportunity to put him to death. This teaching about the Bread of Life was the most costly in all of the Gospels.

The Body of Christ has suffered much through the centuries for the sake of this understanding. The church has been rent into tow camps, Protestant and Catholic, divided in our belief about the significance of this meal. These words of Jesus are startling and visceral, and to one without faith, they sound grotesque. Jesus, the Word made Flesh, has come to be our food. The life of God is offered to us as bread and wine. Take and eat, the priest recites at every Mass, for this is my Body which is given up to you. We do this in holy memory, as Jesus bid us. In fear and trembling, in wonder and gratitude, daring and desiring, we take this food.

Imagine yourself on the threshold of the promised land, the new Jerusalem of our hope. Tell the story, as Moses did, or your journey, and the ways God has tested and sustained you.

How does the church act as one bread, one body, in the world?

How has your understanding of Holy Communion changed over the years? How has it remained the same?

Application: Having consumed the Body and the Blood, we become bread and wine for others. Seek a way to celebrate your vocation to be food: serve a meal in a soup kitchen share lunch with a lonely person, bring the bread of your presence to someone who is in need.

Greetings of Peace. This weekend we celebrate "Father's Day." I hope all dads have a great Father's Day and once again we thank you for your love and care, and the ways you provide for us. You are a gift to us, dads! Thank you.



Summer begins this week on June 21. It is also the "longest day of the year" when we have the most daylight! Enjoy! And may the light of summer and the warmth of the sun remind us of the light of God's love and his radiant, gentle touch.

Here at St. Joan of Arc, we strive to be **good caretakers of our buildings and grounds.** Summer is the time we take on some maintenance and upkeep projects as well as some "capital improvements." Here are some of the projects on the list for this summer:

painting in the rear of the church, the confessional, parish office and other areas -- both inside and outside
waterproofing of some exterior walls of the church and hall that are below grade

A reminder -- since the major work on the remodel of our confessional is done, we have begun to hear confessions again in the confessional. Some detail work is scheduled to be completed (such as painting, window treatments, etc.), but the room is now being used for its intended purpose. We did this work in the confessional in an effort to make sure all people (including priests!) are safe--physically and spiritually.
