Wolff Bros. Supply, Inc. has grown significantly since its humble beginning, but it remains true that the heart of the company is family. Entering its third generation, Wolff employees and family members proudly celebrate Wolff Bros. Supply's 50th Anniversary and remember its unique history.

It all started in the 1950's when Harold and Norman Wolff needed to make a crucial decision – go broke saving the family farm or put their heads together and

create a business their families could depend on. The Wolff brothers decided to go into the mechanical trades – Electrical, Plumbing, and Heating contracting business. Their new company, Wolff Bros. General Contractors, began and operated out of the back of an old



Later, expanding into retail sales, they started using the family dairy barn and chicken coop for parts and supplies. The main floor of the barn housed the offices while the hay loft was filled with tubs and toilets. The old chicken coop became a warehouse for pipe and other plumbing and electrical supplies. By March 1965, the growing business was incorporated as Wolff Bros. Supply, Inc.

In 1972, when the second generation began graduating from college, Wolff Bros. Supply, Inc. entered into the wholesale business working to supply local building contractors' materials. After years of hard work, the company expanded in a major way and turned Harold and Norman's dream into reality. The old farmstead is still there today, but it is now accompanied by a warehouse, showroom, and offices that serve at the corporate headquarters. The


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


HOUSE SUBSTITUTE BUDGET BILL REMOVES MANY TAX PROVISIONS

After returning from spring break, the House Finance Committee adopted substitute HB 64 on Tuesday with several drastic changes. Deleted are increases in sales, commercial activity, tobacco and oil and gas severance taxes. One of the few components of the governor's plan to survive is means-testing for income tax credits and deductions. Instead of a major







overhaul to the tax code that continues a shift away from income to consumption-based taxes, the House plan would instead provide for \$1.2 billion income tax cuts using in large part the projected growth in tax revenue to offset the expense. Those cuts include a 6.3% across-the-board reduction in rates, bringing the top rate below 5%. The new plan also makes permanent a 75% small business tax cut for the first \$250,000 of income.

The House continued to hear testimony on the substitute bill this week with an omnibus amendment expected sometime next week and a vote by the full House later this month.

RCAC TO DISCUSS PETITION TO ADOPT NEW ELECTRIC CODE

At its meeting last month, the RCAC considered a petition submitted by NFPA and NEC with support from several other

interested groups urging the RCAC to adopt the most recent version of the National Electric Code (2014 NEC/2014 NFPA 70). After some heated questioning and discussion on the submittal, the Chairman appointed a subcommittee to further review the 2014 NEC. There were several concerns raised with some of the new code provisions, including additional GFCI protected outlets, as well as, the cost data submitted with the petition. OHBA reminded the committee it is under no mandate to adopt a new code, and has the authority to change/amend as it see fit for Ohio. The Committee's agenda for its April 22nd meeting includes further discussion by the whole committee on the topic.
