

A Haze Over The Statehouse

Not from the heat, humidity or pollution but occasioned by what may result from the coming presidential election. Many here claim to be the visionaries of all things political. But, this current matchup has most just not sure what to expect. Much is at stake, a new president and with it 3 OR 4 Supreme Court appointment and a possible switch of control of the US Senate. The "top" of the ticket influences the remainder of the ticket, thus, the haze of uncertainty.

This is a big concern to the statehouse crowd. Legislative districts are drawn based largely on voters' tendencies. These tendencies are of course, party preferences. The index varies in presidential election years given larger expected turnout. As such, tightly drawn districts (preference wise) become much tighter when the turnout of one party increases and the other does not. Thus, if you are in a marginal district, the total vote may go against the expected result. Republicans hold large majorities in both the Ohio House and Senate so they have more worries at this point. Just the same, both parties are concerned adding to the haze of uncertainty.

All 99 House seats are up and half the Senate (17). Statewide office holders are midterm and not up for election. The concern now is the high negative ratings of both of the presumed major party candidates. This could lead to decreased voter turnout which may impact the expectation based on the index of voter tendency (rep or dem). Folks here are anxious in more normal times; this coming election though has many perplexed much more than normal.

The challenge this year is to get educated so to make a wise decision. Not voting only empowers those who do vote. There is a lot at stake and our industry should accept the challenge of becoming informed and encourage others to do the same.


