




What's different this time ...

Homebuilders Fill Housing Supply Void As Buyers Grapple With Sticker Shock For Existing Homes

Despite high interest rates, the nationwide housing shortage has given homebuilders a boost.

New home sales spiked 20% year over year with 763,000 houses sold in May. Of all the new homes available in the U.S., 28% are offered by homebuilders compared to the historical norm of 13%, according to a recent report from John Burns Research and Consulting.

"The strong demand for housing that had been curtailed by sticker shock and affordability challenges has returned while the housing market adjusted prices and incentives, including rate buydowns and production costs, in order to enable customers to afford needed shelter," Lennar Executive Chairman Stuart Miller said during the company's second-quarter earnings call.



While the average sales price per home delivered by Lennar, the nation's secondlargest homebuilder, dropped to \$449,000 in the second quarter compared to nearly \$500,000 at the peak last year, deliveries were up 3% to 17,074, and new orders increased 1% year over year to 17,885.

"This environment seems to represent a new normal that is formed in the wake of the Federal Reserve's aggressive interest rate hikes starting last year," Miller said.

The success publicly traded homebuilders are enjoying also is propelling their stock prices, which are up 85% year to date on average. Lennar's stock is up 14% in just the last three months.

Danielle Nguyen, vice president of research for John Burns, said the company will monitor the market to see whether the strength continues into the seasonally slower summer months.

"Homebuilders are successfully stepping into the supply void, adding communities and drawing buyers to the new home market," Nguyen wrote in her report.

"Homebuilders have not only weathered the storm but have thrived amidst adversity."

Although homebuilders are seeing a lot of demand for their products because of the housing shortage, they still face several challenges, including getting loans. The bank failures earlier this year put lenders on edge — especially after some customers pulled out their deposits.

"The lack of resale inventory means prospective homebuyers who have not been priced out of the market continue to seek out new construction in greater numbers," said National Association of Home Builders Chairwoman Alicia Huey, a custom home builder and developer in Birmingham, Alabama. "At the same time, builders are troubled over rising mortgage rates approaching 7% and continue to grapple with supply-side challenges, including ongoing scarcity of electrical transformer equipment and growing concerns about lot availability."

PHONES DOWN IT'S THE LAW

As of April 4, 2023, it is illegal to use or hold a cell phone or electronic device in your hand, lap, or other parts of the body while driving on Ohio roads. If an officer sees a violation, they can pull you over.

Drivers over 18 years old can make or receive calls via hands-free devices, including:

- ✓ Speakerphone
- ✓ Earpiece
- Wireless headset
- ✓ Electronic watch
- Connecting phone to vehicle

In most cases, anything more than a single touch or swipe is against the law.



This new law allows drivers over 18 to make or receive phone calls using "hands-free" technology such as Bluetooth or integrated systems within the vehicle, as long as you don't hold or support the device or manually enter letters, numbers, or symbols. If you must physically manipulate your device, you should pull over to a safe location and park your car before handling.

WHAT'S OFF LIMITS?

With very few exceptions, anything that involves using, holding, or supporting a device **while driving** is off limits. This could include:



Dialing a phone number



Updating or browsing social media



Browsing the internet



Playing games



Sending a text message voice to text is legal via "hands free" method



Video calls or FaceTime




Watching videos GPS/navigational displays are allowed



Recording or streaming video

Drivers can listen to audio streaming apps and use navigational equipment if they turn them on before getting on the road or use a single touch or swipe to activate, modify, or deactivate them.

Remember, drivers under the age of 18 are still restricted from using their devices in any way, including hands-free features.





EXCEPTIONS INCLUDE:

- Drivers reporting an emergency to law enforcement, a hospital, health care provider, fire department, or similar emergency entity.
- Drivers holding a phone to their ear only during phone conversations, if the call is started or stopped with a single touch or swipe.
- Drivers holding or using cell phones and other electronic devices while stopped at a traffic light or parked on a road or highway during an emergency or road closure.
- ✓ First responders (law enforcement, fire, EMS) using electronic devices as part of their official duties.
- ✓ Utility workers operating utility vehicles in certain emergency or outage situations.
- ✓ Licensed operators using an amateur radio.
- Commercial truck drivers using a mobile data terminal.

KEEP IN MIND — EVEN IF YOU CAN, THAT DOESN'T MEAN YOU SHOULD.

Looking at your cell phone while stopped at a light can potentially endanger your family, friends, and neighbors. Drivers have a responsibility to watch for people crossing the street or other drivers and bicyclists who haven't yet cleared the intersection. Ohioans are counting on you to pay attention.





ENFORCEMENT

When the new distracted driving law takes effect on April 4, 2023, the Ohio State Highway Patrol and local law enforcement will issue warnings for six months for violations as part of the effort to educate and help motorists adapt to the new law.



Beginning October 5, 2023, law enforcement will start issuing citations for violating this law.



PENALTIES

1⁵¹ offense

Two points assessed to license, up to a \$150 fine.*

2ND offense

Three points assessed to license, up to a \$250 fine.

3+ offenses

Four points assessed to license, up to a \$500 fine, possible 90-day suspension of driver license.

X2

Fines doubled if the violation occurs in a work zone.

Heat safety

In Ohio, we are lucky enough to see the beauty of the four seasons. Snowfall in the winter, blossoms and flowers in the spring, warmth in the summer and changing of the leaves in the fall. But from time to time these seasons can be extreme and we must be prepared to protect ourselves and our employees from these extreme changes. With summer having begun, it is imperative to share with employees the steps to prepare for heat conditions.

One of the Occupational Safety and Health Administration's (OSHA) National Emphasis Programs (NEP) is Indoor and Outdoor Heat Hazards. This NEP is a temporary program in which OSHA focuses their resources on those high-hazard industries where heat can be an issue. The NEP encourages employers to protect workers from heat hazards by providing employee access to water, rest, shade, adequate training, and implementing acclimatization procedures for new or returning employees. It contains both enforcement and outreach/compliance assistance components.

When you create a Heat Emphasis Program include at least the following items:

- 1) Work Practice/Administrative Controls Employers should reduce workplace heat stress by using engineering and administrative (work practice) controls. An engineering control could be a change to the design of the workplace that reduces exposure to heat. Administrative controls are changes to tasks or schedules to reduce heat stress.
- 2) <u>Training</u> Develop a program to train workers before hot outdoor work begins and when to identify high heat situations. Tailor the training to worksite conditions whether it is indoor or outdoor work.
- 3) <u>Acclimatization</u> Acclimatization is the result of beneficial physiological adaptations (e.g., increased sweating efficiency, etc.) that occur after gradual increased exposure to a hot environment. In basic terms, this is getting the body prepared to work in hot environments. Additional information on acclimatization can be found at NIOSH Acclimatization Fact Sheet.
- 4) <u>Hydration</u> Employers should provide the means for appropriate hydration of workers. This can include water or electrolytes. For more information on hydration go to <u>NIOSH Hydration Fact Sheet</u>.
- 5) Rest Breaks Employers should ensure and encourage workers to take appropriate rest breaks to cool down and hydrate. There is additional information on the NIOSH website link NIOSH Work/Rest Schedules Fact Sheet.

Make sure you prepare yourself and your employees on heat safety. OSHA has the authority to ask you about a heat program if they are at your facility inspecting other safety items, so it would be wise to prepare, especially if you are in a high hazard industry. 

OHBA EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

OHIO'S HOUSING BUDGET

The legislature just wrapped up its work on the two-year operating budget. It totaled about \$191 billion expenditures. This does not include the state transportation or workers comp budgets passed earlier. While it includes dozens of topics, some are claiming it was a "housing" budget.



Yes, there was a number of housing incentives in the massive document. For a complete listing, check out our most recent Legislative Review in last month's newsletter. A main beneficiary was for a state funded low-income housing tax credit. Other changes clarified stacking of various incentives too. A new program aimed at tax credits for single family homes also was enacted. We're working on those details now.

Two items specifically

advocated for by OHBA and the Ohio Chamber create tax benefits for newly developed lots and an increase in the number of signatures needed to place a zoning change on the ballot for approval or rejection. In all, this was a new high for pro housing issues. So, what prompted all this?

Very likely, it was due to the decision of Intel to locate in Central Ohio. This was a badly needed boost for Ohio to claim we are a pro development state. We knew well before all this that many companies seeking to expand noticed a lacking housing stock in Ohio. As we have been pointing out for years to whoever would listen that housing starts in Ohio have been lagging for decades. With Intel came a commitment to be more housing conscious. This is a good thing though making meaningful progress will involve increased housing development density and resistance from NIMBYS which is no simple task in a strong home rule state like ours. We are working on those new issues and others. We were pleased to see an emphasis for housing creation though little was heard from local government groups and some stiff legislative opposition from the legislature had to be overcome.

Yes, it's a start to dealing with the housing deficit in Ohio and OHBA will be working hard to find solutions.

BWC updates requirements for Drug-Free Safety Program training

The Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation (BWC) recently updated rule 4123-17-58 for their Drug Free Safety Program and Comparable program. The new rule became effective July 1, 2023. BWC emailed notifications to program participants in May regarding the following rule changes:

- Basic and Advanced Level participants must maintain all supporting documentation and be prepared to submit additional information upon request. Invoices and sign in sheets shall be included for *all* employees that have completed drug testing and training & educational requirements.
- Train-the-trainer materials need to be refreshed at least every five years. Employers are also asked to include the invoice or supporting documents with their supplemental information.
- Employers in the comparable program are now required to complete employee and supervisor refresher training annually. Previously, training was just required one time.
- Contractors must submit a DFSP testing and education plan for inclusion on the list of public improvement construction project contractors.
- For those employers that have worked on a state project during the program year, company records showing at least 5% random drug testing must be maintained or that they were included in a consortium while on the project.
