## Supporting Medina County seniors is our mission

Medina County Office for Older Adults is located at 246 Northland Drive on the ground floor. We offer a variety of social services for seniors and adults with disabilities as well as recreational activities for adults age 60 and over.

Our agency provides the public with a warm and welcoming place to contact for educational programs, information, nutrition, assistance, referral, support and benefits. MCOOA is the best place for family, friends, caregivers and providers to get what they need to support seniors in the community.

2022 was a fantastic year for the office. Adult Protective Services completed their first entire year under the OOA roof and we are providing more comprehensive services to vulnerable adults in the community. We planned and have begun tech classes to educate seniors on their own technology and help them to navigate Android, PC or Mac devices, accompanying classes are one-on-one tech help where seniors can bring in their devices and ask specific questions.

Capital improvements continued with office desk renovations in several areas. We continue to organize and plan for kitchen renovations in 2023.

Our large-scale county events are more popular than ever, with Senior Day 2022 brining more than 500 seniors from all over Medina County to the Medina County Fairgrounds to celebrate. In additional we had an Oktoberfest that was at capacity in the Medina Center. We are looking for an alternative venue for Oktoberfest 2023.

We are heavily supported by the Medina County Human Services Levy as well as the Medina County Senior & Adult Foundation, whose mission is to provide financial support to the programs benefitting seniors through Medina County Office for Older Adults. We thank the citizens of Medina County for their support of seniors.

We look forward to continuing to serve our county in the most efficient and effective ways possible by offering the right service to the right people at the right time. We have figured out that services can still be provided to seniors even in the most challenging times.

I thank all who have supported Medina County Office for Older Adults throughout the year and look forward to our continuing service together.

## **Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC)**

The Aging and Disability Resource Center provides services to adults age 60 and over; 18 and over with disabilities. These services include Specialized Information and Assistance, Benefits Assistance, and Long Term Options Counseling.

Individual **Contacts** 

**Specialized Information and Assistance:** This service helps consumers find the right information, assistance, resources and referrals that they need for their specific issue. MCOOA acts as a conduit for people who need information and then follows up to ensure that they receive the assistance they requested. In 2022, MCOOA's ADRC had 962 contacts with individuals seeking out Specialized Information and Assistance Services.

Hours of Benefits Counseling

Benefits Counseling: A more specialized service, benefits counseling offers consumers the ability to sit down with a trained professional and discuss their finances, seeing where they may benefit from federal, state, or local program offerings. This includes things such as applying for Medicaid, choosing a Medicare Advantage plan or seeking local funds to assist with ongoing financial needs. In 2022, MCOOA's ADRC logged 549.75 hours of benefits counseling with consumers.

Hours of LTO Counseling

Long Term Options Counseling: MCOOA is unique in offering this opportunity for a short term case management program to consumers in need. Options counseling is designed to help individuals and their families assess their current living situation, make changes (if necessary) to maintain placement in the community, set goals for their services and care, and plan for future needs of the consumer and their caregivers. This is a very popular program and allows consumers professional guidance while making informed choice. In 2022, MCOOA's ADRC logged 189.25 hours of Long Term Options Counseling with consumers.

The Medina County Commissioners make the ADRC service possible by Title IIIB funding provided by the Western Reserve Area Agency on Aging through the Ohio Department on Aging.

## **Adult Protective Services (APS)**

Adult Protective Services is a mandated service provided by local social services districts in Medina County. Medina County Office for Older Adults is contracted to provide this service throughout the county, this contract was awarded in September 2021. OOA employs 3 full time social workers to this unit. It involves intake, investigation and assessment of referrals of abuse, neglect and financial exploitation of impaired, vulnerable adults age 60 and over who live in the community. APS workers develop service plans for eligible clients to remedy physical abuse, sexual abuse, emotional abuse, neglect, financial exploitation or to address unmet needs of older adults.


## **Transportation Services**

Medina County Office for Older Adults contracts with Medina County Transit to provide all subsidized transportation services. Transportation is subsidized for any adult age 60 or over and includes direct transit trips to places such as the doctor, grocery store or bank. In 2022, MCOOA provided 6,982 subsidized rides. These trips are paid for in part by Title IIIB money from the Older American's Act. Loop rides in Medina City, Brunswick and Wadsworth are paid for in a monthly bulk rate and seniors that ride the loop are given free transportation if they have an orange OOA transit ID card.

## **Outreach Services**

782 hours of supportive services provided by Outreach workers throughout Medina County, including assessments for transit and meal services as well as supportive services, information and referrals.

## **Congregate Meals**


We were able to offer 5840 meals to our Medina and Brunswick Congregate and Wadsworth restaurant voucher locations.

#### **Home Delivered Meals**


Our Meals on Wheels program provided 42,707 meals throughout Medina County to homebound individuals. This program is also a 'gatekeeper' service in that drivers are checking on the county's most vulnerable seniors four days (5 meals) per week during meal delivery.

## **Senior Farmer's Market Nutrition Program**

In 2021, Medina County Office for Older Adults was awarded Senior Farmer's Market Nutrition Voucher Packets. These packets contain ten \$5 coupons to be used at local Farmer's Markets. All of the packets were disbursed to Medina County residents who meet the age and income requirements. Packets are provided by the Western Reserve Area Agency on Aging.

Of those 40, 17 comprise the Compassion in Action non-medical volunteer caregiving program. In February 2022, MCOOA assumed the operations of Faith in Action, taking over their mission of transportation to shopping and appointments, light yard work, light housekeeping and friendly visits. They transported seniors to 156 appoinments in 2022.
