Service to others is a way of life for Sandy Pianalto, the newest member of the St. Hilary Parish

Foundation Board. Thanks to her Catholic upbringing and education, service is perhaps as representative of who she is as her distinguished career achievements. “The way we are raised makes a difference in how we live our lives,” says Pianalto. “The education I got at St. Sebastian taught me that we should always do what we can to help others.” In fact, Pianalto sees her call to serve on a very personal level, inspired by a poem she recalls that defines success as knowing that someone has breathed easier because you lived. Pianalto says, “I’ve always been happiest and found the most satisfaction when I’ve been able to help an individual, not just an organization.” Harkening back to the lessons she learned at St. Sebastian School, she explains,

“When that is ingrained in you at an early age, you are able to do more things to help make others’ lives easier, and that is so much more satisfying than going to work or going to board meetings.”

Career Is Natural Fit For Board

Going to work and board meetings was exactly what Pianalto did for many years, though. Joining the Federal Reserve Bank of Cleveland in 1983 as an economist in the Research Department, she rose quickly through the ranks and was appointed assistant vice president of public affairs in 1984, vice president and secretary to the board of directors in 1988, first vice president and chief operating officer in 1993, and finally president in 2003. As president and chief executive officer until her retirement from the Bank in 2014, Pianalto participated in the formulation of U.S. monetary policy and led more than 1,000 employees in Cleveland, Cincinnati and Pittsburgh in their work of conducting economic research, supervising financial institutions, and providing payment services

to commercial banks and the U.S. government.

Pianalto acknowledges the obvious importance of her financial connections and understanding of financial markets to her work in overseeing the investments of the St. Hilary Parish Foundation. Beyond that, though, she believes there must be an element of trust. “One of the most important values the Federal Reserve System upholds is integrity, which means doing the right thing in all activities and also making sure the public has confidence and trust in the Federal Reserve,” Pianalto says. “Because the Federal Reserve manages trillions of dollars, we have to make sure the appropriate controls and audits are in place to ensure all of the trillions of dollars are accounted for on a daily basis. That mindset of appropriate controls and auditing is helpful for the St. Hilary Parish Foundation because when people trust their monies to the Foundation, they want to make sure appropriate controls are in place to manage

Mary Jean Carroll was the first person to establish a named fund with the Foundation. Richard Eichner was a loyal, regular donor. The significance of their individual donations became even greater when combined with the funds of other donors to fund needs of the parish and school. Their donations were among the funds that have helped the Foundation amass assets of more than \$7 million, with about \$2.5 million in distributions being given to our parish and school for needs ranging from church choir sheet music and scripts for the St. Hilary School musical to the construction of the Spiritual Center and school gym.

With the passing this year of these donors who have been long-standing friends of the Foundation, the stage is set for the next Mary Jean Carroll or Richard Eichner to make her or his mark on our St. Hilary community by doing small things with great love. In just the 12 months since November 1, 2014, the Foundation has raised over \$450,000 from donations and bequests, and during the same period made grants of over \$188,500 to the parish and school for tuition assistance, scholarships, driveway repairs, technology, sound system and lighting, school boiler/HVAC project, PSR books, Spiritual Center lettering, evangelization, school gym heat exchanger, and convent repairs and renovations. Funding from the Foundation, provided by donors whose individual gifts combined to do great things made fulfillment of these needs a reality. And that was just in one year! Imagine what great things can be achieved in the years to come!

**Great Love Can Do
Amazing Things**

In June of 2014, our parish pilgrimage to France included a stop in Lisieux, the home of St. Therese, also known here in the United States as the Little Flower. Therese was the youngest daughter of Louis and Zelie Martin. Her parents were just canonized by Pope Francis on October 18, 2015! Therese entered religious life as a Carmelite nun when she

was 15 years old. Her four sisters also entered religious life! Therese died of tuberculosis at the age of 24, and it was only then that her writings were discovered and published, and she became known worldwide. She described her spirituality as The Little Way, realizing that she would not be able to accomplish grand or notable deeds as a Carmelite sister, but would instead "do small things with great love." Her simple gestures of kindness and humility became examples of this great love, and inspired many to see the holiness of a life lived following "the little way."

As we celebrate the recent canonization of Therese's parents, it might be good to consider how each one of us accomplishes great things by doing the small things of life with great love. Consider a mom bathing her child, a dad cleaning up the dishes, a teacher tutoring a student, a grandparent reading to a grandchild, a nurse tending to patients, a salesperson listening to a customer's needs, or a coach encouraging his or her team. If all of these activities, and more, are not just simply done, but are done purposefully with love, they become a path to salvation!

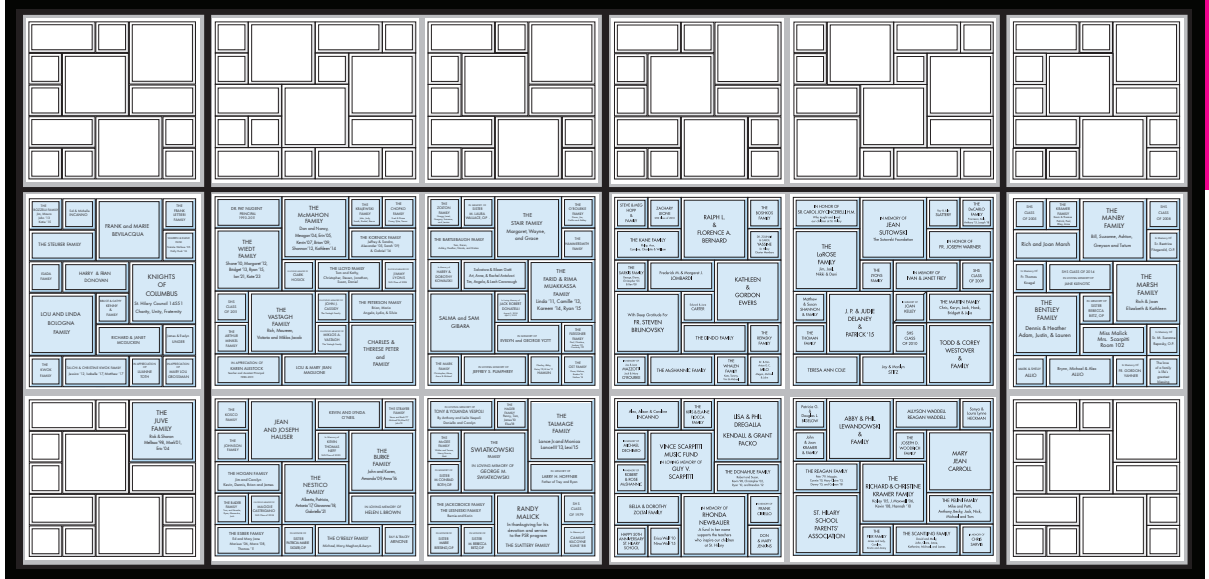

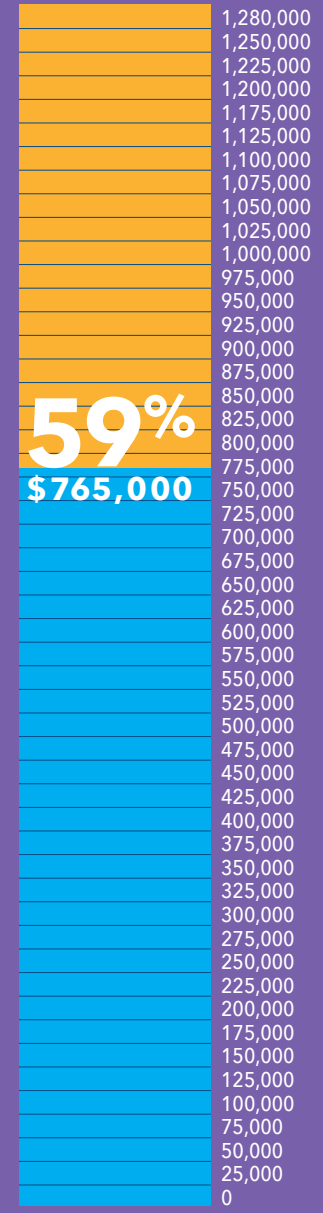

ST. HILARY SCHOOL: Foundation Supports Leaders of Tomorrow

Ensuring that tomorrow's leaders have the support they need to receive an excellent Catholic education is a key focus of the St. Hilary Parish Foundation. The Foundation funded several school-related items in 2015 that made a direct impact on students. The Foundation provided \$30,000 in funds to benefit Kindergarten families by underwriting the registration fee and the fee that helps to defray the cost of our Kindergarten teaching assistants. This initiative, designed to increase Kindergarten enrollment from the parish, had the end result of supporting the school's 75 youngest future leaders and their families. The Foundation also granted \$4,000 in tuition assistance to make a St. Hilary School education a reality for students who might otherwise not have had the opportunity for a Catholic education. Additionally, \$2,825 was granted through the Foundation to help purchase new 1:1 iPads for the school's junior high students.

Supporting Students Through Scholarships

Additionally, multiple scholarships provided funds to students who were selected to receive them. Through the Kevin Thomas Neff Memorial Scholarship Fund, the Foundation awarded a \$1,250 Kevin Neff Memorial Scholarship to current St. Hilary School eighth grader Bridgett Martin. This scholarship, which honors the memory of deceased St. Hilary School alumnus Kevin Neff, annually recognizes one St. Hilary School student who exemplifies the ideals Kevin aspired to during his life. The Foundation also funded its second award through the Jane Klenotic Scholarship. Current St. Hilary School third grader Noah Angle received a \$1,000 award through this scholarship. The scholarship is awarded to one student who is a second grader at the time of the award and has the attributes of spiritual, academic and personal character that were important to Jane. The Foundation also established a new scholarship fund, the Jimmy Lyons Geography Bee Scholarship Fund, that will annually award a \$500



scholarship to the winner of the school's geography bee beginning in 2016. The fund was created to carry on a tradition begun in February, when a scholarship was independently presented to current St. Hilary School eighth grader Braden Ost upon his win of the school's 2015 geography bee. The scholarship was begun in memory of St. Hilary School 2006 graduate Jimmy Lyons, who won the school geography bee for four consecutive years between 2003 and 2006, was a state bee competitor, and passed away in 2011. Additionally, two \$500 St. Hilary Athletic Association scholarships were awarded through the Foundation to Class of 2015 athletes Caroline Kane and Ryan Wiedt. The scholarships are awarded each spring to St. Hilary School eighth grade student athletes who have participated in at least two St. Hilary athletic programs during their eighth grade school year, achieved first or second academic honors during the first, second, and third quarters of their eighth grade year, demonstrate good conduct and sportsmanship on and off the field of play, demonstrate and model Catholic values and morals, and are continuing their education at a Catholic high school. The scholarships are applied to the recipients' high school tuition.

Supporting our Infrastructure

Although bricks and mortar do not dictate the success of a school or its students, appropriate physical facilities are necessary for effective learning to take place. Facilities on the St. Hilary campus are sizable and aging, requiring maintenance and repairs that will sustain them for years to come. In 2012, with that reality in mind, the Foundation undertook the installation of a new boiler unit and air conditioning in the school. Foundation funds in the amount of \$60,000 were used as a first installment to help replace the school's failing boiler, update ductwork and climate control

systems throughout the school, and make possible for the first time the installation of air conditioning in the building. The Foundation paid the fourth of a total of five payments of \$60,000 to help underwrite this project in 2015. The final installment of this ambitious and generous project will be paid in 2016. In addition, the Foundation funded several other important improvements this year, including the replacement of the roof over the junior high section of the building, installation of a new heat exchanger in the gym, new carpeting in the music room, and replacement of the sound system and lighting used for the spring musical and other performances held in Horning Hall.

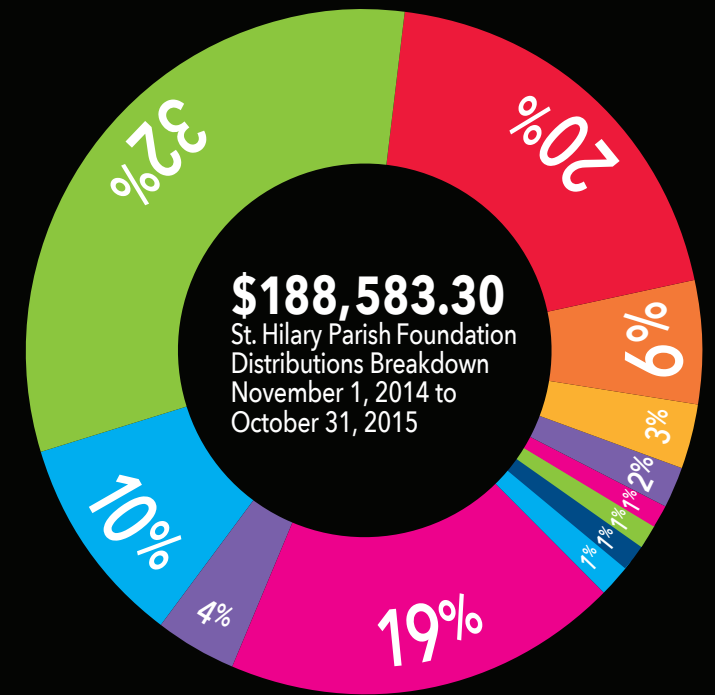

Cash: Tax deductible up to 50% of adjusted gross income. Contributions over that limit can be carried forward for up to five subsequent years.

Publicly Traded Securities: Fair market value tax deductible up to 30% of adjusted gross income. If deduction amount is larger than donor can use in one year, surplus can be carried as deduction over the next five years. Exempt from capital gains tax if stock has appreciated.

Mutual Fund Shares: Tax deductible up to full market value. Effective date of gift and year for which deduction is available determined by date of transfer.

Life Insurance: If protection is no longer needed, begin by irrevocably assigning your life insurance policy to the St. Hilary Parish Foundation and naming it as the sole beneficiary. Annual tax-deductible contributions can be made to cover premium. Or, receive immediate tax deduction equal to policy's cash surrender value if policy is paid.

Real Estate: May include homes, apartment buildings, farms, vacation homes, commercial buildings, and income-producing or non-income producing land. Procedural steps, including site visit, qualified appraisal, preliminary title report and environmental assessment, may be required.

Other Property: May include automobiles, antiques or jewelry. Any item valued at \$5,000 or more is subject to IRS guidelines and must be appraised by an impartial party.

those monies." Having also served at the first community foundation in the country, the Cleveland Foundation, Pianalto has already applied these principles there and notes, "People want to make sure that once their investment is made their funds are well managed." Besides the St. Hilary Parish Foundation Board, Pianalto also serves on the Board of Directors of Eaton Corporation, The J.M. Smucker Company, and Prudential Financial, Inc. She is also Chair of the Board of Directors of University Hospitals and is an Advisory Trustee and an Executive in Residence at The University of Akron.

Education and Gratitude Chart Course In Life

Pianalto attributes her service mindset to those who have helped her, and her career success to her education, beginning with her elementary years at St. Sebastian School. She attended St. Vincent-St. Mary High School and later earned a bachelor's degree in economics from the University of Akron and a master's degree in economics from George Washington University. She is also a graduate of the Advanced Management Program at Duke University's Fuqua School of Business and holds honorary degrees from eight universities. The daughter of parents who immigrated from Italy when she was five years old, Pianalto says, "My parents came here speaking no English, and my sister and I could have been thrown into public school but were fortunate to go to St. Sebastian. We learned appropriate manners, how to study, and how to learn." Pianalto shares that the family arrived in June, with just a few months until the school year would begin, and one of the sisters at Our Lady of the Elms volunteered to help her and her sister learn English. Additionally, the family received support from the International Institute to help them assimilate into U.S. culture. "We were the beneficiaries of people who volunteered and gave back," says Pianalto. "I am grateful to them and now I feel it is important for me to give back and help others. When I do community service I feel I get more back than I give. I get to meet and work with some wonderful people, and I love the feeling of being helpful."

In her service to the St. Hilary Parish Foundation Board, Pianalto is again inspired by her own education as she supports Board President Ed Carter's vision of making a Catholic education at St. Hilary School a reality for every family. Carter's goal is for the school endowment fund to eventually support a low- to

no-tuition school. Pianalto says that while she understands the practicality that the Foundation cannot pay tuition for everyone, being able to provide a Catholic education to students whose parents are not able to afford it is important. "In my career at the Bank, we did a study that looks at what drives income growth in a region," explains Pianalto. "The top two factors are educational attainment and innovation. Education is what is going to improve individual lives and our region's economy. Some students do not have the financial wherewithal to pay tuition, but we can make a difference if we can provide them with an excellent Catholic education, and they will make a difference in the world because of that."

Pianalto realizes that the contributions of each member of the St. Hilary Parish Foundation Board, just like those of each donor to the Foundation, may be small standing alone, but together they can make a great impact. "I am very supportive of the Foundation," she says. "The individuals who had the vision to start it are making the parish stronger and providing wonderful opportunities and a higher quality of parish life. I am grateful to be part of that."
