Vision Guides Parish Foundation

St. Hilary Parish and its school are blessed to have a visionary looking out for their best interests. Ed Carter. President of the St. Hilary Parish Foundation Board, was one of the founding members of the Foundation when it was established in 1976. After more than 30 years of involvement with the Foundation, with 27 of those as its President, his commitment to the parish and its fiscal solidity remains as strong as it was at the beginning. Working with four different pastors over the years, Carter has had to learn the style of each priest and finesse a business relationship with each one. "The different pastors came to the Foundation to handle things they saw as needs for the parish and the school to grow," he shares. "The Foundation was always the cornerstone. Nothing ever got started without Foundation funds." During the many years the Foundation has been helping the parish and school, Carter is proud that solicitation of donations to the Foundation has never hurt the weekly offertory collection.

Board Provides Sound Management


Carter and the Foundation have built on the vision of St. Hilary's founding pastor, Fr. Edward Horning. Carter recalls Fr. Horning as a new pastor at a new parish, having to walk across pallets and through mud to get to the church and the school as they were being built, and yet having the foresight to take a few hundred thousand dollars in seed money and save it to safeguard the future of both. Since its inception, Foundation members have gone to many other

parishes, at the request of the Diocese, to help them set up their own foundations. He gives much of the credit for the Foundation's success to its Board of Trustees, which he describes as a "most perfect" group. He explains, "Their commitment, their attitude, and their intellectual experience in this world of chaos is outstanding." Carter describes the board as a diverse group of loval individuals who have grown with the job of managing the Foundation and love what they do. "Even in the hardest of times," he says, "the Foundation will grow with their management." Along with the board, he credits current St. Hilary Pastor, Fr. Steve Brunovsky, for his role in keeping the parish and school fiscally viable. "He knows the umbrella [of the Foundation] is there, he uses it, and he supports it."

A New Vision

Notable projects the Foundation has aided include the expansion of the church, the building of the Spiritual Center, the expansion of the school, and the addition of Horning Hall, with many smaller-scale but no less important needs funded along the way. All the while, the Foundation has continued soliciting donations and working on growth. Most gifts from the Foundation have been initiated by requests from the parish or school to underwrite specific needs. A few years ago, though, Carter says he had a thought and approached Fr. Steve with it. Troubled that school tuition was being increased each year to help contain the subsidy the parish annually gives to support the school, Carter came up with an idea to fund that shortfall in another way. "I had this idea that if we could get enough in a

A Decade of Gratitude

I caught myself somewhat by surprise recently when it occurred to me that 10 years have passed since I began my work as Development Director with the St. Hilary Parish Foundation. In those 10 years, I have been

blessed to witness incredible generosity that has allowed our Foundation to grow exponentially.

I am truly grateful to you, the donors, who have supported the Foundation and put your trust in us over the past decade. During that time, your generous support has made it possible for the Foundation's assets to grow from \$1.3 million to over \$5.6 million. What a phenomenal tribute to our Parish, the Foundation, and especially all of you who are so extraordinarily charitable!

Since 1979, just three years after its inception, the Foundation has invested more than \$2.2 million back into our church and school for much-needed capital improvements, projects and programs, as well as support for tuition assistance, scholarships, athletics, and teachers' salaries. This year alone, the Foundation has distributed over \$105,000 for various needs such as new choir risers, scholarships, the hearing loop in the church, technology, the school boiler/ HVAC project, sheet music, carpet in the rectory, and evangelization. With such an extensive list of items to fund in just one year, there is simply no way the Foundation could do all that it does without ongoing donor support.

Ongoing support is what our St. Hilary Legacy Society is all about. It is heartwarming to hear from donors who have

Have you ever considered the IMPACT of your daily activities and commitments? Who is being helped? What difference do you make? How are people changed? Recently, I was reflecting on the


statistics regarding the 114 ministries that we have here at St. Hilary Parish, as well as the activities of our parish school. Did you know that St. Hilary parishioners and clergy minister to Catholics in 10 area nursing facilities that are in our parish boundaries? Did you know that over 578 parishioners are involved in liturgical ministries that enhance our communal prayer, such as lectors, Eucharistic ministers, ushers, singers, musicians, artists, and dancers? This is just the tip of the iceberg! When you consider all of the people involved in ministries of prayer, worship, education, social outreach, and administration, the IMPACT of the St. Hilary community is huge!

Many times, when people consider making a financial commitment, they want to know what the IMPACT of their donation will be. They want to know that their gift will make a difference! I can say confidently that the donations made to the St. Hilary Parish Foundation make a big difference. Crystal **Commemoratives** Update

Commitments and pledges are already over 52%, with installation of first and second sets of committed panels in place.

Crystal Commemoratives are unique, individually crafted, etched and beveled glass panels, installed over the windows in the connecting hallway between the

school and the gymnasium. They are a perfect way to leave a legacy, remember a loved one or celebrate a special event.

Three sizes offer a choice of participation levels, with the two larger sizes featuring bigger typography for the commemoration. There are 62 6"x 6" panels available for a donation of \$2,500 each, 30 12"x 6" panels remaining for a donation of \$5,000 each, and only 30 12"x 12" panels left for a donation of \$10,000 each. If all are pledged, these commemorative panels will help raise over \$1,200,000 for the St. Hilary School Endowment Fund.

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ST. HILARY SCHOOL: Foundation Supports School with Vision for Future

A vision for the future is critical in ensuring the long-term viability of any entity. Through the gifts it makes today, the St. Hilary Parish Foundation not only assists with present financial requirements, but looks to the horizon with a vision for needs yet to arise. The Foundation bears the responsibility of supporting not only St. Hilary Parish, but also St. Hilary School, which is operated by the parish. With two large buildings on the St. Hilary campus, some of the greatest needs come in the form of repairs and upgrades that will keep the physical facilities healthy well into the future. In 2012, the Foundation embarked on a generous and ambitious project by supporting the installation of a new boiler unit and air conditioning in the school. Sixty thousand dollars in Foundation funds were used to help replace the school's failing boiler, update ductwork and climate control systems throughout the school, and make possible for the first time the installation of air conditioning in the building. The Foundation has pledged to make a total of five payments of \$60,000 to help underwrite this project, the second of which was paid in 2013.

Keeping Technology Updated

The Foundation has also been supportive of the school's aim to stay on the cutting edge of technology. After funding more than \$15,000 toward new computers for teachers in 2012, the Foundation provided \$12,400 to purchase four SmartBoards and seven SmartBoard projectors in 2013. SmartBoards have been in use in the school for nearly a decade, and as the devices age, they must be replaced. This instructional technology, coupled with the school's integration of iPads into the classrooms, is vital to guaranteeing students and staff continue to have the



most current technological resources available. With SmartBoards in every classroom, replacement of this equipment will be an ongoing need for the foreseeable future, and the Foundation is pleased to assist with this first phase of refurbishment.

Aiding An Office Makeover

Helping the school update in other ways, the Foundation's School Endowment Fund gave \$2,500 to fund improvements in the school office during the summer of 2013. Outdated secretarial desks were replaced with sleek, modern pieces, and new furniture took the place of old in the waiting area of the outer office. Coupled with fresh paint colors and some framed prints of St. Hilary students portraying leaders, the Foundation-funded furniture gives the school office an updated, welcoming feel.


Assisting Students and Building Community

The Foundation also funded several other school-related items in 2013. To support the school's goal of building community, the Foundation provided \$500 toward hospitality for the semiannual St. Hilary School Grandparents' Day event. While this gift generally impacted hundreds of school families, two additional gifts directly benefited students currently enrolled in the

school. Through the Kevin Thomas Neff Memorial Scholarship Fund, the Foundation awarded a \$1,500 Kevin Neff Memorial Scholarship to current St. Hilary School eighth grader Jacob Thoman. This scholarship, which honors the memory of deceased St. Hilary School alumnus Kevin Neff. annually recognizes one St. Hilary School student who exemplifies the ideals Kevin aspired to during his life. The St. Hilary Parents' Association Fund, under the umbrella of the Foundation, gave \$4,000 in tuition assistance to make a St. Hilary School education a reality for students who might otherwise not have had the opportunity for a Catholic education.



Your Generosity is Appreciated With Foundation gifts such as these being made each year, your generosity is essential to ensuring the ongoing growth of Foundation funds. Faced with present and future needs at both the school and the parish, the Foundation must work to maintain its resources at levels that will allow it to keep pace with these financial demands and safeguard its vision for the future. school endowment, we could get the funds in the endowment to the point where tuition is virtually nothing," he says. "Fr. Steve championed the idea that if we can get the school endowment up there, we could move toward no increase in tuition, then lower tuition incrementally over a five-, six- or seven-year program. As the program grew and we managed the money well and got a good annual return, we might reach a point where tuition would be \$100 or less.'

Support Will Make Vision a Reality

Carter theorizes that if the Foundation manages its money carefully, the endowment can grow about \$500,000 each year. The goal, he says, is to amass about \$5 million in the school endowment fund. The endowment fund currently holds about \$1 million, while the Foundation has roughly \$5.9 million in total assets. "There are examples from across the country," he says of parishes that have raised money to enable their schools to be tuition-free."It can be done, especially with the quality teachers we have, the Blue Ribbon recognition, and how our children handle themselves. They do well in everything they participate in, and I am so proud of them."

Carter feels with so much good behind it, the school is worth every dollar raised through the endowment. He also knows if a school endowment can be grown anywhere, it can be grown at St. Hilary. "We have one of the best parishes in the Diocese, one of the most generous parishes in the Diocese. At the Foundation, we get individual gifts, life insurance policies, and even real estate," he says. He hopes that as the growth of the endowment unfolds, the school's Parents' Association will support it, as well. And of course, the students of today will be the donors of tomorrow, helping to further the cause well into the future. Carter proposes that if tuition assistance funds are kept high and flowing, students who otherwise could not attend St. Hilary School can have that opportunity, and will become alumni who will someday give back."I envision down the road, with the cooperation of the pastor and his staff, we will get the endowment up there and be able to stop [tuition] increases and lower tuition to almost nothing," Carter says. "We are being backed by Fr. Steve, and we're on our way." Carter's vision is ambitious, but as the endowment grows steadily under his leadership, it brings the distant dream of a low- or no-tuition school into ever-closer focus.

Family Named Funds can be established with a \$5,000 gift. Funds may be designated as unrestricted, in which the Foundation Board determines the greatest needs and grants awards based on the particular fund, or as restricted, in which funds are used for a specific purpose.

Other Designated Funds consist of funds donated with a particular intent for their use.
