Foundation funds have provided scholarships, teacher bonuses, educational materials and computers, carpet and flooring and much more. Along with the parish and dedicated staff, parents and volunteers, the Foundation helps make St. Hilary among the best elementary schools in the region.

Sustaining the school endowment is a wonderful investment in our children's future. It can maintain and uphold quality education and spiritual leadership. In difficult economic times, the Foundation's support can help the school offset operational increases.

Making the *impossible, possible* Dear Parishioners and

Benefactors: More than 1.9 million dollars... does that sound like a lot of money? This is the amount the St. Hilary Parish Foundation has given to the parish and school since 1983 through the generosity of donors like you. Viewed

another way, this amount represents roof replacements, tuition assistance funding, the construction of buildings, refurbished statues, new vestments, fresh carpeting and tile, hearing devices, instructional salaries and bonuses, stained glass windows, updates to the rectory, cushioned pews and kneelers, acoustic treatment in the school gymnasium, computers for the school, hand chimes, classroom SmartBoards, and much more.

Impressive, right? Now, here's what I'd like to add to this list... No more school tuition increases! Impossible, you say? Maybe not! With St. Hilary School celebrating its 50th anniversary this school year, the Foundation is focused on building the School Endowment Fund. Our goal is to raise 1.2 million dollars by the end of this anniversary school year. Why the School Endowment Fund? Endowed funds are distributed based on an annual percentage, so the base funds grow and create a continuous circle of funding. With a significant school endowment, we could end, or at least hold down the amount of, tuition increases, thus making a Catholic education at St. Hilary School affordable for all of our parish children.

One vehicle for contributing to the School Endowment Fund is through the Crystal Commemorative Campaign, which is now in full swing. Through this campaign, donors at certain levels are honored with an etched crystal, bearing the inscription of their choice, affixed to the windows in the school's Horning Hall alcove. Two window sections are already adorned with

crystal panels honoring generous donors who recognize the value of Catholic education, with additional sections soon to be installed. Your donation in tribute to your family, student, parent, class, favorite teacher, or any person you choose to honor can make a significant difference for the future of St. Hilary School. To date, \$345,000 has been pledged in this campaign, with \$238,379 already received. It's a great start, but there is a long way to go!

Crystal Commemoratives Update

Commitments and pledges are already over 25%, with installation of first set of committed panels in place.

Crystal Commemoratives are unique, individually crafted, etched and beveled glass panels, permanently and invisibly bonded to the windows in the connecting hallway between the school and the gymnasium. They are a perfect way to leave a legacy, remember a loved one or celebrate a special event.

Three sizes offer a choice of participation levels, with the two larger sizes featuring bigger typography for the commemoration.

There are 120 6"x 6" panels remaining available for a donation of $$2,500 \text{ each}, 50 12'' \times 6''$ panels remaining available for a donation of \$5,000 each, and only 41 12"x 12" panels left available for a donation of \$10,000 each. If all are pledged, these commemorative panels will help raise over \$1,200,000 for the St. Hilary School Endowment Fund.





ST. HILARY SCHOOL AT 50: *Still Building a Foundation for Life*

Fifty years... Half a century. For most of us, more than half a lifetime. By any standard of measurement, fifty years is a long time to maintain consistency and produce quality. Yet, that is precisely what St. Hilary School has been doing since its doors opened on September 5, 1960.

Sure, many things have changed over 50 years. School leadership, faculty and staff have evolved, students have come and gone, and even the school building itself

has grown. However, the more some things change, the more they stay the same, as the saying goes. That is absolutely true in the case of St. Hilary School.

In the uncertain times of the 1960s, when parents sought a school in which their children could learn Gospel values and be formed by faith, St. Hilary School answered the call. The fledgling school's firstyear enrollment was a respectable 261 students. Today, times are no less uncertain and parents still seek a faith-based, values-grounded education for their children, with enrollment standing strong at just shy of 650. 

Catholic schools and the families who attend them. Those challenges are what drove the Bernards to give back to a host of local Catholic schools. Many of these schools have endowed scholarships available to their students from the Bernards' own Ralph L. and Florence A. Bernard Family Foundation. Hundreds of students have already been the beneficiaries of this extensive scholarship program, and because of the Bernards' foresight, many future students will have the same opportunity. At Mr. Bernard's funeral Mass, the pews were filled with students and parents who have been blessed by the Bernards' generosity. Their presence was a tribute to Mr. Bernard's "dash" and how he spent it.

Here at St. Hilary, we also have been blessed by Mr. Bernard's "dash", dating as far back as 1959. Few people are aware that it was the Bernard Construction Company which served as general contractor for the construction of St. Hilary School more than 50 years ago. The building that today houses the school doubled in its earliest years as both school and church. More recently, shortly before his death, Mr. Bernard's generosity funded the St. Hilary School mobile laptop computer lab, as well as SmartBoards for two classrooms. His philanthropy allowed the school to keep pace with burgeoning technology, and set the stage for future technology upgrades.

St. Hilary Parish Foundation Director Diane Sarkis was truly moved upon learning that Ralph Bernard had made a specific bequest to benefit St. Hilary School. "For Mr. Bernard to extend to the years following his death his already generous legacy of giving during his lifetime is a real blessing," notes Diane. "His beguest will go a long way toward ensuring the broadest possible availability of Catholic education at St. Hilary School." Because Mr. Bernard believed in the quality of Catholic education, he directed that his bequest be earmarked to provide tuition assistance and/or scholarships for any students who may not be able to afford to attend St. Hilary School. As a result, The Ralph L. and Florence A. Bernard Endowed Scholarship Fund was established through the St. Hilary Parish Foundation. Due to their remembrance of St. Hilary in their estate planning, Mr. and Mrs. Bernard are members of the St. Hilary Legacy Society... which is only fitting, considering the legacy of Mr. Bernard's "dash."


